On June 11, 2003, Sarri Singer was severely injured when a suicide bomber exploded the No. 14 bus she was riding in Jerusalem, killing seventeen people and injuring more than one hundred.

She is the founder of Strength to Strength, a global network supporting victims of terror and trauma. Through this work, Sarri has become a leading advocate for long-term recovery frameworks and national policies that establish clear consequences for terror and contribute to deterring future attacks.
